The start of a year is somewhat of a new start. Here in Smyrna, starting the year in prayer is important to us. It is our deepest desire to follow our Lord's will together in all we do. That's why every now and then we need to calibrate our compass and decide the direction. That's why a period of seeking God in prayer is the best possible start, both for us as individuals and together as a church. We want to support you and your daily devotions during the prayer period with this booklet. We challenge you during this period to take an extra daily moment in prayer during this period. We also want to encourage you to participate in some of our corporate prayer gatherings (Monday-Friday 12.00 and 18.00, Sunday 10.00, 14.00,18.00).

Another tool that can help focus in prayer is fasting. Fasting is to decide for a period of time to withhold from something that actually is good (you should always withhold from bad things). A fast is a food-fast. It can be withholding from all food or just certain meals or types of food. Over the past few years we have recommended the Daniel Fast, which means eating vegetables or vegan depending on how strictly you interpret it. On Smyrna's website we will be posting some tips and recipes concerning this. Another type of fasting is withholding from something that otherwise is a natural part of your life. It can be for example social media, TV or something of special interest. Irrespective of what type of fasting you choose, fasting is having a certain focus for a period of time. It is a reminder for yourself and a way to show God that you are entering into a special time of prayer. Withholding from everyday things gives you more time for prayer as well.

This year's theme is: In the name of the Father, Son and the Holy Spirit. Doing something in somebody's name is all about doing something as a result of the person's will, spirit and authority. Our prayer is that 2019 will be the Father's and Son's and the Holy Spirit's will, spirit and authority!

## KNEELING BEFORE THE FATHER

*For this reason I kneel before the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth derives its name. I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God.*

*Ephesians 3:14-19*

Many years ago I heard a man of my age talk about that he struggled so much with his life that he had to start each day with kneeling before God. "If I can bow down I won't have the strength to rise up". That was pretty much what he said. You can pray in a thousand different ways, but it is especially in kneeling, if that's physically possible, that we tell ourselves something important: that God is exalted and holy and we are His servants. It's all about daily using our bodies in order to maintain life's perspective. You don't bow down out of fear or submissiveness. But rather out of reverence, respect and trust for the Father. Apparently this way of thinking, kneeling before the Father, has something to do with the spiritual view. When Paul writes that he wants to bow before the Father then wonderful words flow from his pen; regarding the glorious wealth, regarding power and strength for our inner being, regarding height and width and depth in the spiritual realm. I think there is a connection here. Kneeling down is ancient and not any more unusual than doing push-ups. This is the soul's push-ups.

When world history seems to have reached its darkest point, That's when Jesus places His feet on the Mount of Olives, grabs the earth out of the hands of sin and places it in the Fathers hands.

Jesus meets the Samaritan woman by a well outside the village of Sychar. The disciples are preparing a meal so Jesus and the woman are by themselves. They have a long, exciting conversation with each other and when the woman realizes that Jesus is a prophet she poses a what seems to be quite unusual question. "Our ancestors worshiped on this mountain, but you Jews claim that the place where we must worship is in Jerusalem."

Jesus' answer probably shocked her when He said that there will come a time when the Father will be neither worshipped on the mountain in Samaria nor in Jerusalem.

When Jesus died on the cross it says that the curtain in the Temple was torn in two which is a picture that we now have access to God. But it is also an illustration that God's presence here on earth, God's Spirit moved out from the temple. God no longer allows Himself to be confined to a limited place, a certain mountain. Paul explains it later as that God's Spirit leaves the temple and that our bodies instead become a temple for the Holy Spirit.

Worshipping in spirit and in truth is therefore receiving Jesus into your life and worshipping Him through the life we live. God doesn't let Himself be confined to a certain place, He is not only found in churches on Sundays between 11.00 and 13.00. He resides in you and me and He works in and through you and me. At your school, at your work-place, amongst your neighbours. Your and my life can be worship and praise to our heavenly Father. That is what true spiritual worship is to be.

## THE SERVING SON

*"For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."*

*Mark 10:45*

If someone asked you to describe what you believe about Jesus in one sentence, what would you say? There's so much to what we believe about Him and why He came and what He did. It's really tough to put it in just one sentence! Our verse describes what we believe about the Gospel--the good news of Jesus--in one simple sentence. Notice two key parts to it: First, Jesus sets the example of being a servant. He was a servant to God--doing His will in everything. But then He was a servant to so many people (washing their feet; healing them; teaching them; being patient with them). And the key to being a good servant is HUMILITY.

A word that we don't find in our culture much today, but is the key. It's the key to approaching God and it's the key to loving your neighbour. Secondly, Jesus paid the full price for you on the cross. We don't understand it all, but God's perfect justice demands some kind of payment for sin. For everyone's sins. And Jesus came and paid that full price. The word for "ransom" was often used when a person bought freedom for a slave. The slave was now a free person because someone else paid the price to set them free. In the same way, Jesus has paid the price to set us free from the power of sin. It doesn't mean that we are perfect, but it does mean that sin no longer defines us and no longer holds us in its grip. By the blood of Jesus on the cross for us, we are set free.

## HE MUST BE THE SON OF GOD

When Mark writes his Gospel he includes many occasions when Jesus is called God's Son. Right in the first verse of the first chapter he himself testifies: "The beginning of the good news about Jesus the Messiah, the Son of God." Then follow some episodes regarding confessions of Jesus as God's Son, but it is always the spiritual dimension that does so. It is the evil spirits that confess Him in the encounter with the possessed or the Father Himself that talks of Jesus as His beloved Son on the mount of transfiguration in the sixth chapter. But it is not until Calvary that a person, only for the second time since Mark's confession, calls Him God's Son. And the words come from the man who was responsible for His execution when seeing Jesus draw His last breath of air. With the officer having the occupation he had, that he most likely had observed many take their last breath. And those that he had crucified prior to this had hung there and drawn their final breath in humiliation and mortification. This as a reminder for all that the true power was in the lord he served; emperor in Rome. But when Jesus gives up His spirit in humiliation the representative of the emperor cannot do anything else but confess the truth.: "This man must have been the Son of God." The final breath is a breath of life for all mankind, for the officer, for you and for me. Do you want to receive it today by confessing: "Jesus, You must be the Son of God."

## THE SAME SPIRIT

*For we were all baptized by one Spirit so as to form one body—whether Jews or Gentiles, slave or free—and we were all given the one Spirit to drink.*

*1 Corinthians 12:13*

Right in the midst of this tough time they receive this message from Jude, Jacobs brother, where his exhortation is to build your life on faith in Jesus and live in prayer in the Holy Spirit. The preposition "in" is quite interesting. The New Testament pattern for prayer is that we pray to the Father, through the Son and in the Holy Spirit. So, we pray to God but at the same time in God.

In difficult times, when trials and challenges replace each other, Jesus can many times seem so distant. We shout to God as if we don't think He can hear otherwise! Jude says we are to pray in the Holy Spirit, in! As Christians we are already surrounded and imbedded in God's presence. God is already with us and in us through the Holy Spirit. In our struggles, in the middle of our battles God is already present.

Jude's next exhortation is that we stay in God's love.

Jesus expresses it similarly when He in John 15 says:

"Remain in me, as I also remain in you." What fantastic words! We can live our lives in Jesus at the same time as He says that He is in us. In other words, He surrounds us both from the inside and the outside. You can hardly get closer to God than that.
